Learn the basics of sewing machine quilting by making samples of traditional and modern patchwork quilt blocks and finishing them into a mini-quilt.

Read below to find out what to bring on the <u>very first day of class</u>, and what we'll discuss in class for purchasing once the class has started.

FIRST DAY OF CLASS

You will be provided fabric on the first day of class as we sew a test quilt block to introduce basic techniques and discuss the fabric and materials needed for the rest of class.

Please bring these supplies on the first day:

- Self-healing cutting mat size 18" x 24" or 24" x 36"
- 6" x 24" acrylic ruler
- 45mm rotary cutter (there are different handle styles, pick one that works for you)
- Basic sewing supplies; scissors, thread snips, pins, seam ripper, pincushion
- One medium spool of white, All-purpose polyester 40-weight sewing thread (Gutermann Sew All Thread is sold at most sewing/crafting/quilting stores)

You will need to bring fabrics to sew blocks **on the second day of class**. Please use 100% cotton, medium-weight fabrics (quilting fabric, novelty fabric, shirting weight fabric).

- Sources are local quilt or sewing stores, JoAnn Fabrics, Hobby Lobby, the Evanston Waste Shed, or thrift stores if using men's 100% cotton shirting.
- Bring at least 8 different fat quarters or quarter-yard cuts, or you can look for a fat quarter bundle that you like.
- Scraps of all sizes are fine as long as some of the scraps are bigger than 12" x 12"

Please Note: Classes and workshops may be canceled if enrollment minimums are not reached. You will be notified by telephone at least 3 days prior to the scheduled start date should cancellation become necessary.
