
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FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS AND PAYMENT PLANS



Wooden bowls are very unique, practical, and fun to make. Come out and work on our lathes using carving tools to finish two bowls in one day. Instruction and first attempts are in the morning, and then in the afternoon there will be time for guided practice and finishing.

1-DAY WORKSHOP **LEARN TO KNIT PART 1: CAST ON, BIND OFF,** AND KNIT STITCH

Cathy Montoya Sunday, 9/11, 1-4pm

Learn the very basics of knitting in this workshop class - cast on, bind off, and knit stitch. After a bit of practice, we will start on a scarf pattern which incorporates the knit stitch, increase, decrease, and short rows. In a hand-dyed or striping yarn, the effect is stunning. No previous knitting experience is necessary. Even if you already know how to knit, this is a fun technique to learn. It is also a good traveling project as every row is done the same. Materials: 100 grams wool or wool blend in a bulky weight with US 10.5 or 11 straight needles. Solid and striping yarn, and needles will be available for purchase in class, if desired.

LEARN TO KNIT PART 2: PURL STITCH

Adding the purl stitch to the knit stitch opens the door to creating an endless number of stitch patterns. You will learn to knit different stitch patterns from written directions and charts while making a sampler. Must already know how to cast on, bind off, and knit to take this class. Materials: 100 grams of a solid color bulky weight yarn and US 10 or 10.5 needles. Yarn and needles will be available for purchase in class if desired.

LEARN TO CROCHET PART 1: CHAIN AND SINGLE CROCHET

Cathy Montoya Sunday, 10/2, 1-4pm

In this class, we will start with the basics - a chain stitch and single crochet - which we will use to make a ripple stitch cowl, which combines the single crochet stitch with increases and decreases. You will learn how to adjust the size of the ripples to write your own pattern for future projects. No previous crochet experience necessary, but if you already crochet and would like to learn how to do the ripple stitch, feel free to join in. Materials: The cowl takes about 220 yards of worsted weight yarn. You can choose to do it all in one color, or to change color every 2 rows. In the sample, I used two different color skeins of Noro Silk Garden, which is a yarn which stripes on its own. Alternating the 2 striping varns gives a wonderful effect. Solid and striping yarn will be available for purchase in class, if desired. A size I or J hook is required for class.

We will be building on the skills learned in Part 1 by adding a double crochet and a new stitch pattern to your repertoire - the shell stitch. This stitch works great for scarves or afghans, and because the rows are wavy, it looks good in stripes or multi-colored yarn. Must already know chain stitch and single crochet to join this class. Mosaic knitting is a technique developed by Barbara Walker as a way to easily work a 2-color stitch pattern. Each color is worked for 2 rows, slipping the stitches of the other color into the pattern. You will have your choice of several different patterns. Must know how to cast on, bind off, and work the knit stitch to participate in this class. Materials: 1 skein each of 2 different colors, either solid or striping yarn, in worsted weight, app. 110 yards each color for a cowl, plus US 9 or 10 straight needles. Solid and striping yarn, and needles will be available for purchase in class, if desired.

ADVANCED TECHNIQUES: SURFACE TREATMENTS Katie Susko

Friday 1-4pm **Ceramics Studio**

Advanced surface design techniques are lively and colorful ways to enhance pottery and sculpture. Different surface design techniques covered will include sgraffito (carving through layers), mishima (in-lay), slip trailing, stencil and stamp design and application (store- and handmade), resist techniques (wax and underglaze), image transfer, and silk screen application. All of these techniques can be used on functional pottery (cups, bowls, plates, teapots, pitchers, etc.) as well as sculptural forms and tiles. This class will give students a chance to explore the variety of options to decorate and enhance their ceramic surfaces in a new and creative way.

DIGITAL MEDIA AND FABRICATION

The Digital Media and Fabrication Studio at the Evanston Art Center is the essential space to explore design, photography, video, 3D printing, and laser engraving processes and techniques. If you can imagine an image or an object chances are it can be made in this studio.

For these classes students must be proficient in Mac and PC computer operating systems. In addition to courses, people can buy studio time in the Maker Lab for \$10 an hour as an Independent Study. Independent Study Membership is \$75 a year. To schedule time in the Maker Lab please contact us the week after the start of classes.

During the Introduction to Digital Cinema students will have the opportunity to learn what it takes for a film to go from an idea to a final product you can watch and share with the world. We will be covering the 4 stages of production (pre-production, production, and post-production) so that students can learn and understand the roles and departments needed on set, how to prepare and run a shoot, properly organize and collect their media, and edit what they shot. Furthermore, students will also get to learn how to perform some of the duties of a film set and get experience with cinematography, lighting a scene, audio, and additional camera stabilization tools. They will be learning about different lens types and how certain lenses can change the way you tell your story with cinema as a medium, as well as understanding the camera settings and using additional tools for the camera such as sliders, dollies, and steadicam/3 axis gimbals. Additionally, they will be learning how to light a scene and work with different lighting and diffusion techniques such as 3-point lighting, color temperature and how it can change your story. The audio overview will cover and teach the students how to use external audio sources such as field recorders, booms and lavalieres to capture audio, and the different ways to use them on set. Lastly, the roles they will be learning about are directing and what it takes to work not just with your actors but the rest of the crew, producing and preparing a shoot and working with your director to understand and work together on the vision of a project, and editing all the media and working with both the director and producer to get the final product ready and out into the



Complexities are built by layering and become changeable with variations in the amount of pressure, with different added mediums of oily combination, and the various ways to apply and remove the ink before the press use by brush, roller, fingers, rags, ad infinitum. This is an art form of surprise with a bit of a trickster incorporated to usurp expectations. When these spaces open, much student support and encouragement is given toward discovery.
